Adopt-a-pioneer Researcher's Guidelines



Thank you for volunteering to research Pioneers for our Pioneer Register.

The purpose of this research is to lay a foundation for people who are conducting their own family history research. It is intended that your research should provide the basic foundation detail on a **Family Group Sheet**. If you wish to have a **template** to type into please contact Kath Fisher who will email this to you or download from FPFHG website. Do not be overly concerned if you find that some information cannot be found. Just do what you can. However, if you find yourself interested in your pioneer please feel free to continue your research as far as you would like. Additional supporting information such as photos, copies of documents and/or newspaper articles may be added. Please acknowledge the source details of **all information submitted** e.g. Genealogy Source, Family story, data base name, publication name etc

Your **hard copy** research (**A4 pages only**) will be filed in the **Register** and **scanned**. Basic information is **recorded on an index card**. **Pioneer names** will also be added to the online Pioneer Register database which is regularly updated.

Submissions Checklist

- 1) **Fleurieu Peninsula Pioneers ONLY before 1900**
- 2) **Family Group Sheet**
- 3) **Your own research with sources noted**
- 4) **A4 paper only – no staples**
- 5) **Photos – scanned or digitally printed on A4 ONLY.**
- 6) **Eligible adult children (per above No 1 requirement) to have own file with group sheet etc.**

RESOURCE OPTIONS:

- **FPFHG Resource Room (RR) open every 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month from 1.00pm to 3.30pm.** Computers are available including access to the most popular research sites. NB for Ancestry or Find My Past please request a booking via **TEXT** to RR Manager, Chris Grivell. Hardcopy cemetery records, BDM SA records plus SA shipping records can be accessed. There is also a broad range of books available for lending, plus plenty of friendly help to you get started if required.
- **Online sites** such as:

- **Genealogy SA [SAGHS]** have a large research library at 201 Unley Road, Unley, open from 10.00 am to 9.00 pm on Tuesdays and 10.00 am to 4.30pm on Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday and 1.00pm to 4.30pm on the 2nd and 4th Sundays only. (Phone number 8272 4222)
- The **State Library** and **local libraries** have comprehensive collections of sources. Check their online sites for opening times and sources available.
- Note that for quality control all research sources must be acknowledged on your **Family Group Sheet and/or on the submitted page of information.**
